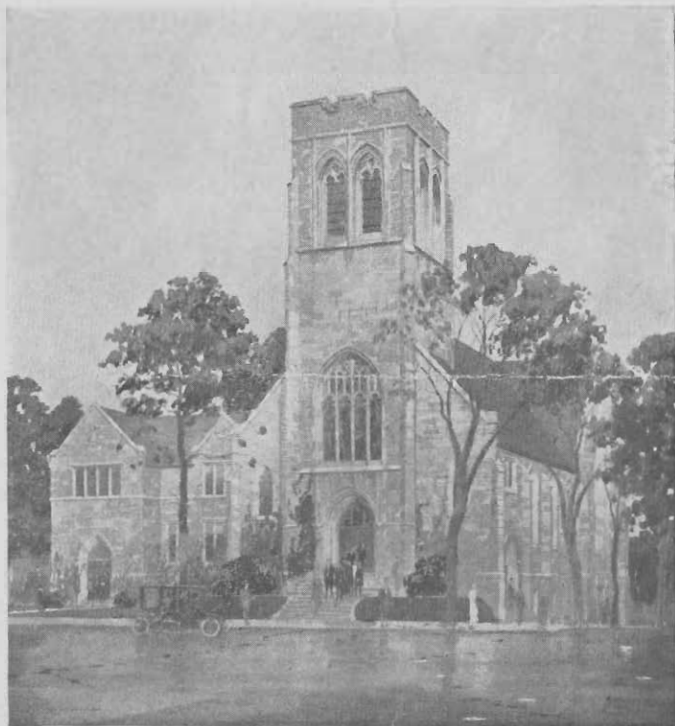

THE NEW ORGAN

The new organ was built by Mr. M. P. Moller, Hagerstown, Md., and is a splendid musical instrument, having three manuals and a pedal organ, of the latest electro-pneumatic action, with every appliance for the complete control of the instrument by the organist. The wind is furnished by a Kinetic electric blower and is maintained at a regular pressure of 5 inches. The organ has 35 stops, grouped as:— Great Organ 8, Swell Organ 11, Choir Organ 10, Pedal Organ 6. These, with 21 couplers and other mechanical actions and adjustable pistons, will provide abundant opportunity for the display of artistic skill and ability of the organist and provide music for all churchly and concert purposes.
